


Clough Nursery Unit Parents' Newsletter January 2022



Welcome back to a new term and a new year at Nursery! We would like to thank you all for the very generous Christmas gift which we received from you. It was a lovely surprise and we really appreciate your thoughtfulness.

This term is always a busy time for us as we continue to learn through play. We will also be doing some *group work* to develop our receptive and expressive listening skills (i.e. listening and talking) as well as playing games to increase our mathematical skills eg matching, sorting, creating repeating patterns.

As we continue to concentrate on the children's *language development*, every *Wednesday* morning we will begin our day with **News Time**, when the children can talk to each other and share news together. If they wish, the children can bring in a photo of a toy or a visit or an activity to show and talk about with their class mates. (Please note that the children cannot bring actual toys into Nursery yet on account of Covid-19.)

Sadly, the threat of COVID is still very real.
